"How do you select your caregivers?"

Each [caregiver](#) goes through a thorough application process, which includes a drug screen and criminal background check. We also check our caregivers with the abuse registry and sex offender registry.

"How do you train your employees?"

Complete Home Care Services of Tennessee hires licensed caregivers who have been through state required programs. In addition, we provide continuing education on topics such as HIPAA, fall prevention, elder abuse and caring for patients with Alzheimer's.

"Are your services available for the elderly in nursing homes or assisted living facilities?"

Yes, we provide companion services to facilities and hospitals.

"What makes Complete Home Care Services of Tennessee different from other companies?"

The loyalty of our caregivers, dedication from our staff members and our experience stand out from other companies. In addition, we understand the importance of family and providing quality healthcare.

"What happens if a caregiver is sick?"

"Who pays the caregiver – me or you?"

The minimum number of hours are twice a week at four hours minimum each. Our rates depend on the type of service you are requesting.

Our caregivers are bonded and trained, have gone through thorough screening and receive continuing education quarterly to assure they are qualified, well-trained caregivers.
